JUDICIAL BRANCH

U.S. Supreme Court

Established by the United States Constitution and began to take shape with the passage of the Judiciary Act of 1789. The first assembly of the court took place in 1790, with the Honorable John Jay named as Chief Justice of the U. S. Supreme Court, establishing the judicial branch of the United States Government. Supreme Court Justices are nominated by the President of the United States and confirmed by the United States Senate. They serve on the court until they resign, are impeached and convicted, retire or die.

While it is not a mandate, typically the Chief Justice administers the presidential oath of office.

ILLINOIS LEGISLATURE

The Illinois General Assembly, now in its 103rd session, is composed of a 59-member Senate and a 118-member House of Representatives. One Senator is elected from each legislative district every four-year cycle. These districts are divided into two representative districts and one representative is elected from each representative district every two-year cycle. They are responsible for passing bills into law, approving the state budget, confirming appointments to state departments and agencies, acting on federal constitutional amendments, and propose constitutional amendments for Illinois. They are also responsible for the impeachment and conviction of executive and judicial officeholders in the state.

ILLINOIS STATE SENATE

State Senators are elected for four-year terms. Every two years approximately half of the Senate is elected so that not all Senators are up for election at the same time. There is a total of 59 members in the Illinois Senate. Currently, the Democrats are the majority party with 40 members and the Republicans, the minority, with 19 members.

Illinois Court System

The Judiciary of Illinois is the unified court system of Illinois responsible for applying the Constitution and laws of Illinois. It consists of the Supreme Court, Appellate Court, and Circuit Courts. The Supreme Court oversees the administration of the court system.

Illinois Supreme Court

The Supreme Court of Illinois is the state supreme court and consists of seven justices including a chief justice.

The court has limited original jurisdiction and has final appellate jurisdiction. It has mandatory jurisdiction in capital cases and cases where the constitutionality of laws has been called into question and has discretionary jurisdiction from the Illinois Appellate Court.

Illinois Appellate Court

The Illinois Appellate Court is the court of first appeal for civil and criminal cases rising in the Illinois circuit courts.

Three Illinois Appellate Court judges hear each case and the concurrence of two is necessary to render a decision. The Illinois Appellate Court will render its opinion in writing, in the form of a published opinion or an unpublished order. As of 1935, decisions of the Illinois Appellate Court became binding authority upon lower courts in Illinois.

The Illinois Appellate Court has fifty-four judges serving five districts, administratively centering around Chicago (1st District), Elgin (2nd District), Ottawa (3rd District), Springfield (4th District), and Mt. Vernon (5th District).

Civil cases appealed from the Illinois Appellate Court are heard by the Supreme Court of Illinois upon the grant of a Petition for Leave to Appeal under Illinois Supreme Court Rule 315, a Certificate of Importance under Illinois Supreme Court Rule 316, or a Petition for Appeal as a Matter of Right under Illinois Supreme Court Rule 317. The same rules apply to criminal cases.

Illinois Second District Appellate Judges

Illinois Circuit Court

The Illinois circuit courts are trial courts of original jurisdiction. There are 24 judicial circuits in the state, each comprising one or more of Illinois' 102 counties. Six circuits comprise solely of a single county; these are Cook, Kane, Will, DuPage, Lake, and McHenry. The other 18 circuits each contain between 2 and 12 counties.

The circuit court has general jurisdiction and can decide, with few exceptions, any kind of case. The circuit court also shares jurisdiction with the Illinois Supreme Court to hear cases relating to revenue, mandamus, prohibition, and habeas corpus. However, if the Supreme Court chooses to exercise its jurisdiction over these cases, the circuit court may not decide them. The circuit court also reviews administrative decisions of certain state agencies.

DeKalb County operates under the township form of County Government; the governing body is the County Board. As the legislative element, County Board is responsible for adopting all Ordinances for the governance of DeKalb County, which laws are contained in the DeKalb County Code; establishing a budget, as well as, levying taxes, promulgating policies, rules and regulations for the management of County operations. The County is divided into Twelve Districts based on population. Members are elected to four-year terms. One member is elected in each District every two-year cycle.

However, all twenty-four members are elected at the November General Election in the second year following a decennial census. The County Board meets on the third Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Other meetings may be held when called by the Chair or requested by at least one-third of the members. The County Board has eight standing committees, which meet regularly once each month. Each member serves on two committees. Committee appointments are made by the Chair, with the concurrence of the County Board.

Board Members serve concurrently as Commissioners of the DeKalb County Forest Preserve District. The Commissioners' meeting is held immediately following the County Board meeting on the third Wednesday of each month. Officers include a President and a Vice-President, elected in the same manner as officers of the County Board. Traditionally, these officers are the same officers as the County Board. The President appoints seven Commissioners to serve as a standing committee. This committee meets regularly each month.

DeKalb County Chief County Assessment Officer's Mission Statement: Our goal at the DeKalb Chief County Assessment Office is to provide to the constituents of DeKalb County accurate, efficient, and timely assessments of property valuation. In order to achieve this goal, the Chief County Assessment Office serves the resident taxpayers of DeKalb County with assessing their property value in accordance with the Property Tax Code (35ILCS200).

What we do for DeKalb County:

- Assemble township assessors for instruction on the assessment process.
- Maintains the parcel ownership record.
- Receive and analyze township assessment rolls.
- Equalize assessments within the county or any area therein.
- Apply various exemptions to homestead properties.
- Publish the assessment roll for each township in general reassessment year (quadrennial year).
- Provide mailed notice to owners of property which has been reassessed or changed by the Township Assessor, CCAO, Mapping Department or Board of Review.
- Certify assessment roll to the Board of Review.

- Serve as Clerk of the Board of Review; act as Chair of the County Farmland Assessment Review Committee.

Each year the Board of Review convenes on/or before the first day in June. The board consists of three members appointed by the County Board. Two members must be from the political party receiving the highest vote for county office and one member from the other political party. The duties of the board include reviewing assessments made by Township Assessors, adding omitted property, and hearing all complaints on real property.

All complaints of error in assessments must be made in writing to the board on or within 30 days after the date of publication of the assessment list. (Reference is made to 35 ILCS 200 /16, of the Property Tax Code.)

The Board of Review also has the duty of equalizing assessments by township within the county. The board may increase or reduce any assessment as it determines is just. The board rules on all Home Improvement, Senior Citizen, Disabled Persons, and Veteran Exemptions. All certificates of error must be signed by at least two members of the Board of Review. When the board completes its work, the lists of assessed valuations are certified to the County Clerk to compute tax rates.

The Circuit Clerk position is an elected one, voted on by the people of DeKalb County. It is a Constitutional office and part of the 23rd Judicial Branch of Illinois, along with Kendall County. Our office is in the historical DeKalb County Courthouse located in the heart of downtown Sycamore.

The Circuit Clerk is the official record keeper of the Court. All Civil, Probate, Traffic, Criminal and Juvenile cases are filed through the office. A deputy clerk attends all court proceedings and keeps a record of all happenings. This is the only way through which the files reach the court. We also collect and disperse all monies ordered to be paid by the court.

The primary function of the Community Development Department, (formerly Planning, Zoning and Building Department) is to help direct and manage growth and land use changes in DeKalb County.

The principal way in which the Department aids in such management is through the interpretation, application and enforcement of the County's Unified Comprehensive Plan, Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, building codes and Stormwater Management Regulations by facilitating an efficient development process and influencing investment in the community. The Department provides staff support and offers advice and assistance to the County Board, Planning and Zoning Committee, Zoning Hearing Officers, Economic Development Committee, DeKalb County Business Incubator and other County departments, as well as to local communities and citizens.

The Community Development (CD) Director:

- Serves as the County Zoning Administrator, Plat Officer, Code Enforcement Officer, Economic Development Officer, and is primarily responsible for interpretation and enforcement of the Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, Stormwater Management Plan and Ordinance, and Unified Comprehensive Plan.
- Serves as the Director of the DeKalb County Regional Planning Commission, a cooperative organization consisting of representatives from 14 municipalities and the County that serves as a forum for communication and coordination on issues of regional importance.
- Chairs the County's Stormwater Management Planning Committee.

The Department Staff:


- Manages the DeKalb County Business Incubator.
- Prepares and updates elements of the Comprehensive Plan for the County.

- Helps coordinate planning activities for the various communities within the County.
- Reviews and issues all building permits for construction in unincorporated DeKalb County.
- Conducts inspections of construction.
- Investigates complaints of zoning violations.

Authority for final interpretation and application of the Unified Comprehensive Plan rests solely with the DeKalb County Board.

Pursuant to Chapter 34, Illinois Revised Statutes, DeKalb County has a Zoning Hearing Officer to conduct public hearings to consider Zoning Map Amendments, Zoning Text Amendments, requests for Special Uses, Variations and Appeals of decisions from the CD Director. The Hearing Officer has final administrative decision authority on bulk regulation Variations and Appeals, and makes findings and recommendations to the County Board on Amendments, Special Uses and Use Variances. Subdivision review and approval is the jurisdiction of the Planning and Zoning Committee and the County Board.

<u>Coroner</u>

The coroner investigates all sudden, natural and violent deaths in the county, which appear to be accidental, homicidal or suicidal to determine the cause and manner of death.

At their discretion, the coroner may summon a jury composed of six persons of legal age and conduct an inquest into the cause and manner of death. The purpose of the inquest is to present pertinent information concerning the victim's death in order for the jury to arrive at a cause and manner of death. The cause of the death is often readily apparent and obvious based on the facts, circumstances, medical evidence, and in some cases toxicology and autopsy results. The real essence of the juror's responsibility is to establish the manner of death (suicide, homicide, accident, natural or undetermined.) When a vacancy occurs in the Office of the Sheriff, the Coroner assumes the office temporarily until the vacancy is filled by appointment or election.

The DeKalb County Emergency Services & Disaster Agency was created by an ordinance passed June 16, 1976. The Agency was created to combine all Emergency Preparedness Programs including Civil Defense. By state law, E.S.D.A. is a required county department.

The purpose of E.S.D.A. is to mitigate potential hazards, plan for, coordinate, respond to and aid in recovery from all disaster situations whether natural or man-made.

This dual office of County Clerk/Recorder has 5 major functions:

- (1) Clerk of the County Board and Keeper of the County Records
- (2) Keeper of Vital Records (including birth, death and marriage records)
- (3) Tax Extension Clerk (computation of property taxes and redemption of delinquent taxes)
- (4) Recorder (maintain all Land Records for DeKalb County)
- (5) Chief Election Authority for the County

The functions of DeKalb County Clerk:

The office of the County Clerk operates under the laws and statutes of the State of Illinois and is one of three county level offices that is commissioned by the Governor.

By law, the County Clerk also files assumed names for businesses, issues marriage licenses and records statements of economic interest. As a service to the public, the County Clerk's office processes passports and supplies information on national, state, county and local governments. The County Clerk's office is the repository for vital records for DeKalb County residents. The office has county birth and death certificates dating from January, 1878. The Clerk's Office has issued marriage licenses since the founding of the county in 1837. Certified copies of birth, death, and marriage licenses may be obtained from the County Clerk's Office, Vital Records Division, for a nominal fee.

The operations of the County Recorder are specified and required by the Illinois Compiled Statutes. The Recorder is required to record all documents submitted by the public which conform to the standardization laws, to maintain accurate sets of maps (or "plats") which show the current ownership of every tract of land in the entire county, and to perform all functions of a clerical and technical nature to accomplish that objective.

In DeKalb County, by order of the County Board, the Recorder also maintains a "Tract Index" of real estate transactions which indicate the title to property and any mortgages or liens against it. The chain of title may be traced back to the original government grant in this Tract Index and in the Grantor/Grantee Indexes.

The Recorder also maintains and keeps on file all Federal Tax Liens, State Tax Liens, and Uniform Commercial Code filings. Certified copies of recorded Military Discharge papers (DD-214s), are provided free of charge to Veterans with proper identification.

Requests for certified birth records for individuals born in DeKalb County can be submitted in person, by mail, or online at <u>https://www.vitalchek.com</u>. Due to the confidential nature of these records, only the individuals named on the record or their legal parent or guardian may obtain a certified birth record.

Death Records:

A certified death record may be obtained by a relative or an individual with a financial interest in the estate of the deceased. Request for certified death records can be submitted in person, by mail or online at vitalchek.com. Marriage & Civil Union Records:

Marriage records are available from the year 1837 to current for individuals married in DeKalb County. Marriage records are considered genealogy after 50 years. Genealogy records can be ordered online at https://www.dekalbgenealogy.com/, by mail or in person in the office.

A certified copy of a marriage or civil union records can be obtained by either party listed on the certificate. Requests for records can be submitted in person, by mail or online at <u>https://www.vitalchek.com</u>. Marriage & Civil Union Licenses:

Individuals who intend to be married or joined in a civil union in DeKalb County must apply for a license in person at the County Clerk's Office. Since December 1, 1980, all elections have been governed under the provisions of the General Election Law of the State of Illinois, commonly referred to as Election Consolidation. With the implementation of Election Consolidation, the County Clerk is responsible for the administration of all elections within the County. However, the local election official, such as the township and municipal clerk, school district secretary, etc. is still an integral part of the electoral process. These are the people who work with the County Clerk to certify the names to be placed on the ballot for local elections.

Voter Registration – Who is Eligible to Vote?

- You must be a United States Citizen.
- You must be 17 years old on or before the date of the Primary Election and turn 18 on or before the date of the General or Consolidated Election.
- You must live in your election precinct at least 30 days prior to Election Day.
- You must not be serving a sentence of confinement in any penal institution as a result of a conviction.
- You may not claim the right to vote anywhere else.

What forms of identification are needed to register to vote?

Two forms of identification are required when registering to vote. At least one must show your current name and address.

Acceptable forms of identification include, but are not limited to:

- Illinois Driver's License
- Illinois State Identification Card
- Employee or Student Identification Card
- Credit Card
- Social Security Card
- Birth Certificate
- Utility Bill
- Mail (Postmarked within the past 30 days) which has been addressed and delivered to you at your current address
- Valid Passport

Where to Register:

You may register to vote in person:

- At the DeKalb County Clerk's Office, 110 E. Sycamore St., Sycamore (815) 895-7147
- At a Secretary of State Driver's License Facility (applying for or updating your Driver's License or State ID).
- With a duly appointed Deputy Registrar.

By mail:

 A mail-in application may also be obtained from the State Board of Elections website, <u>https://www.elections.il.gov/</u>. The mail-in form must be postmarked by the last day to register to vote before an election and mailed to our office.

You may also register, or change your voting address using the Illinois State Board of Elections Website, with their Paperless Online Voter Application process: <u>https://ova.elections.il.gov/</u>.

Your registration is permanent unless you move or change your name. If you move within DeKalb County, you must notify us in writing or by email of this change. If you have moved outside of DeKalb County, you must re-register in your new jurisdiction. If you have changed your name, you must re-register.

Physically Disabled Voters:

Persons with a permanent physical disability or seniors with mobility issues can arrange for a special registration card which allows them to automatically receive a Vote by Mail application prior to each election. Please contact the Elections Department for information.

Military and Overseas Voters:

Illinois citizens, who live overseas or serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, who will not be in their home county on Election Day, may register and vote by using the Federal Voting Assistance Program. The Federal Voting Assistance Program provides a Federal Postcard Application (FPCA) form which permits members of the U.S. Armed Forces, their dependents and U.S. citizens abroad, to cast a Vote by Mail ballot and if necessary, to register to vote. This completed form may be submitted by mail, fax or e-mail to the DeKalb County Clerk/ Elections Office. Voting by Mail:

In June of 2021, a new law became effective establishing a Permanent Vote by Mail status option for voters in Illinois. Once on the

Permanent Vote by Mail list, a ballot would automatically be mailed to the voter, at each future election. Any properly registered county voter may request a Vote by Mail ballot application. The application may be obtained in person from the County Elections office, by phone, or by visiting our Elections website: https://dekalbcountyclerkil.gov/voting-by-mail/.

Early Voting:

All DeKalb County Voters may participate in Early Voting, which begins 40 days prior to the election and runs through the day before Election Day. DeKalb County has several Early Voting sites to conveniently serve all voters. Grace Period Registration/Voting:

Grace Period Registration is an extension of voter registration from the regular close of registration. Same Day Registration is available on Election Day, through the close of the polls. All Grace Period and Same Day Registration individuals must vote on the same day as they register to vote.

DeKalb County Court Services is responsible for providing a variety of services to adult and juvenile offenders as well as pretrial defendants under the jurisdiction of the Court. The Court Services Department is comprised of the Juvenile and Adult Probation Units, Community Restitution Services Program, and Pretrial Services. The existence of Court Services is due to statutory requirements as found in the Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 730, Section 110, The Probation and Probation Officers Act. The Act includes provisions for a system of probation and its duties and responsibilities under the authority of the Chief Judge of the Twenty-Third Judicial Circuit.

Court Services staff responds to the needs of the Court, the offenders, and the community by implementing evidence-based practices in the course of their daily work. The Probation Officer's role is to function as an agent of change – a case manager who orchestrates a variety of processes and interventions to ensure the offender is given what is needed at the right time to accomplish a positive behavior change. The Probation Officers assess and identify the offender's criminogenic needs to reduce the risk of re-offending and to become more prosocially orientated. Using social learning techniques, the Probation Officers use skills to help motivate the offenders, refer to the right programs, reinforce the learning that takes place, and provide accountability to the process. Court Services Officers work closely with the Judiciary, the local police departments, social service agencies, schools, the State's Attorney's Office, and the Public Defender's Office. Court Services also reports to the Law and Justice Committee of the DeKalb County Board.

The Finance Department is responsible for managing a comprehensive financial system for the County; developing and implementing the annual budget; overseeing the accounting of all department funds and financial procedures; processing accounts payable for all county departments; maintaining a record system including all revenues and expenditures; and acting as an information source and making recommendations to the County Board on all financial policies, procedures, and corresponding ordinances.

The County budget, appropriation, and tax levy ordinances are prepared for the County Board by the Finance Director. In addition, the finance office handles payroll and personnel records and administers employee benefit programs such as health insurance, pension plans, deferred compensation plans, etc. Administration of the county's risk management function is also the responsibility of the Finance Department including self-insured workers compensation and liability insurance programs. Additionally, the county is audited annually by an independent CPA firm retained by the County Board and the Finance Department coordinates the entire audit process.

The DeKalb County Health Department, a department of county government, was founded in 1966. The Health Department offers a full array of public health programs and is certified by the Illinois Department of Public Health. The Health Department has four divisions.

The Administration Division oversees all administrative functions of the Health Department, including finance, human resources, planning, and program accountability. The Health Department is the County Registrar of the Vital Records Program for the issuance of birth and death certificates.

The Health Protection Division goal is to safeguard food and water from contamination. Services include regulation of private sewage systems and potable water. Additional programs include food sanitation, solid waste management, nuisance control and enforcement of tanning and body art regulations. The Animal Control Program provides stray dog and rabies control.

The Community Health and Prevention Division provides maternal and child health services such as Childhood Immunizations, the Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Nutrition Supplement Program, the Family Case Management Program for pregnant women and infants and the Family Planning and STD Program. In addition, the Communicable Disease (CD) Program provides services to prevent the spread of communicable diseases.

The Health Promotion and Emergency Preparedness Division oversees inperson counselors who provide assistance with enrollment in the Health Insurance Marketplace and expanded Medicaid implemented as part of the national Affordable Care Act. The Health Promotion Program provides services to the public to promote good health, improve the level of health knowledge within the community, and inform the residents of available health resources. The Emergency Preparedness Program improves county response capacity in the event of a public health emergency through planning activities

The DeKalb County Engineer, under the direction of the County Board, makes improvements to and maintains the highway system. Some of these duties include maintaining the shoulders, ditches, drainage structures and pavement surfaces on county roads.

The County Highway Department maintains 188 miles of bituminouspaved highways and 44 bridge structures on the county road system. These interconnect with over 801 miles of township roads and 142 township bridges of the nineteen townships. The Department also provides inspection of all county and township bridges every two years, reporting those findings to the Illinois Department of Transportation as required by Statute.

Other duties are maintaining highway and construction equipment, snow and ice removal, signing and roadside mowing. In conjunction with the County Highway Committee of the County Board, the County Engineer sets priorities for highway construction; administers the preparing and letting of contract proposals for bridge and road construction and directs the engineering staff through contract completion.

The County Engineer and his staff also provide engineering expertise and advise to township highway commissioners. As a result of cooperation between township highway road commissioners, personnel and other municipal officials, (as well as a close adherence to road standards) a well-maintained highway system can be found throughout DeKalb County.



- Regional Superintendents are locally elected officials who administer Regional Offices of Education, which are grouped by county or counties throughout Illinois.
- Respond to legal questions from educators, boards of education and other citizens. Issue, register and renew teacher certificates.
- Supervise and assist in transportation programs, scientific literacy programs and other staff development programs.
- Administer the G.E.D. testing programs and issue diplomas.
- Disseminate information on scholarships and teacher vacancies.
- Conduct professional growth opportunities.
- Approve school calendars, in-service days, workshops and institutes.
- Conduct hearings for School Districts reorganization.
- Administer Truancy Intervention programs and Safe School Alternative Education programs.

Cooperation Management

- Assist the Illinois State Board of Education in the evaluation and recognition of public schools, and private schools who ask to be recognized.
- Maintain maps of all school districts.
- Administer cooperative programs.

Transportation

The Regional Office is responsible for conducting the initial training required for all new school bus drivers prior to getting a bus permit and the annual refresher workshop required in the 12-month period prior to renewal. Experienced drivers must take a two-hour refresher course annually, and all new drivers must take an eighthour course in school bus driver safety and first aid, as prescribed by the Illinois State Board of Education and administered by the ROE.

The DeKalb ROE also offers Criminal Background Check services (fingerprinting), provides a Testing Center for GED, teacher preparation, career promotion assessments, and coordinates substitute teachers for all of the schools in DeKalb County.

The Office of Sheriff originated in England in the 9th and 10th Century and is the oldest existing law enforcement unit in history. The expansion of the British Empire brought the Office of Sheriff to the colonies where it evolved into part of the American democratic fabric. Sheriff's Offices are a full-service law enforcement unit throughout the vast majority of counties in the United States.

The DeKalb County Sheriff's Office has four basic areas of service. They are the Field Operations Division which includes patrol, civil process, and electronic home monitoring; Corrections Division which is responsible for the operation of the County Jail, prisoner transport, and Court House Security; Communications Division which includes the 911 Combined Communication Center; and Investigation Division which handles most criminal and other indepth investigations.

There are 103 full-time personnel that provide service in these areas, as well as records and administration. The Sheriff's Office is available twenty-four hours a day, 365 days a year to serve the citizens of DeKalb County.

The State's Attorney has the exclusive responsibility for prosecuting violations of the criminal laws of the State of Illinois, as well as traffic violations. The State's Attorney provides legal advice to all County Officials and represents the County in all actions where the County's officials or employees are a party.

The professional staff includes twelve Assistant State's Attorneys and nine support staff. The State's Attorney's staff is present in four courtrooms on a daily basis and routinely appears in branch court in DeKalb and Sandwich. Professional assistance to law enforcement agencies is available on a 24-hour basis every day of the year.

The DeKalb County Treasurer serves as both Treasurer and Collector for DeKalb County.

As Collector, the Office prepares bills and receipts for the collection of real estate taxes, drainage taxes, and mobile home taxes within the county.

The Collector will collect, invest, and distribute more than \$218 million in property taxes this year. Taxes collected are invested while they are in the Treasurer's custody, prior to distribution. Interest earned on investments is distributed to the County's taxing districts proportional to the amount of tax collected for them. Property tax funds are distributed to more than 186 taxing districts in the county.

A tax sale is held at the end of each tax year to sell the tax on all parcels that remain unpaid.

The County Treasurer has the responsibility to receive, invest and distribute the revenue and public monies of the County.

She also collects and distributes, as required, transfers of monies from the state and federal governments. These transfers include, in part; sales tax, supplemental sales tax, income tax, income tax surcharge, salary reimbursement, replacement tax, emergency management assistance program monies, and motor fuel taxes.

The Treasurer also keeps accounts of all monies paid out stating the date, to whom payment is made, and on what account payment is made. Payments must be specifically authorized by law or by the County Board. Each month, the Treasurer reports to the County Board the amounts of money invested in banks listed by account. The County's funds are invested locally. Investment objectives are safety of principal, liquidity, and maximum rate of return.

The Treasurer serves as the ex-officio Treasurer for the DeKalb County 911 Emergency Telephone System Board (ETSB) and for Drainage Districts.

The Treasurer's Office administers the Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program. Property taxpayers who are 65 and older with a total household income of no more than \$55,000 may qualify for this program.

Between 1926 and 1976 a father and son team held the office of DeKalb County Clerk. Earle Joiner from 1926-1956 and Ralph Joiner from 1956-1976. It was Ralph's dream that the old records and other memorabilia, scattered throughout the Courthouse, could find a new, permanent home.

In the early 1980's Phyllis Kelley spent 18 months cataloging and indexing the contents of the old vaults. In 1988, work began transforming 400 square feet in the basement of the Courthouse to the Joiner History Room and dedicated to Ralph Joiner, his wife Bertha and Earle Joiner for their efforts in preserving the county's historical documents. Joiner History Room opened to the public on May 4, 1989.

In June 1998, following an agreement between the DeKalb County Board and the Sycamore Library Board, the Joiner History Room collection moved to space in the Sycamore Library.

As the Joiner History Room collection expanded, storage became a concern. In 2019 the Joiner History Room became part of the DeKalb County History Center and is now located in a much larger space and has expanded hours.

DeKalb County Board, by Resolution, determined that Jury Commissioners would be appointed by the Presiding Judge of the Circuit Court. The said commissioners each serve three-year staggered terms.

The Jury Commission is responsible for preparation required in establishing and summoning potential jurors. Qualified candidates are randomly selected by an automated system and are known as the jury list used for Petit, Coroner's, and Grand Jury's. The list is revised and amended annually. The potential jurors are chosen from a combined list of DeKalb County voters, DeKalb County State ID holders and DeKalb County Illinois driver's license holders from the Secretary of State. From this combined list the potential jurors are chosen arbitrarily by a computer program.

The Commission is responsible for the construction, refurbishing and/or maintenance of County buildings for which lease agreements are executed with the county.

The Public Building Commission also provides and maintains the records storage areas, for all county departments, as required by the Illinois Compiled Statutes. The PBC has constructed and maintains secure, climate-controlled storage areas to house all the historical records for the county dating back to 1835.


