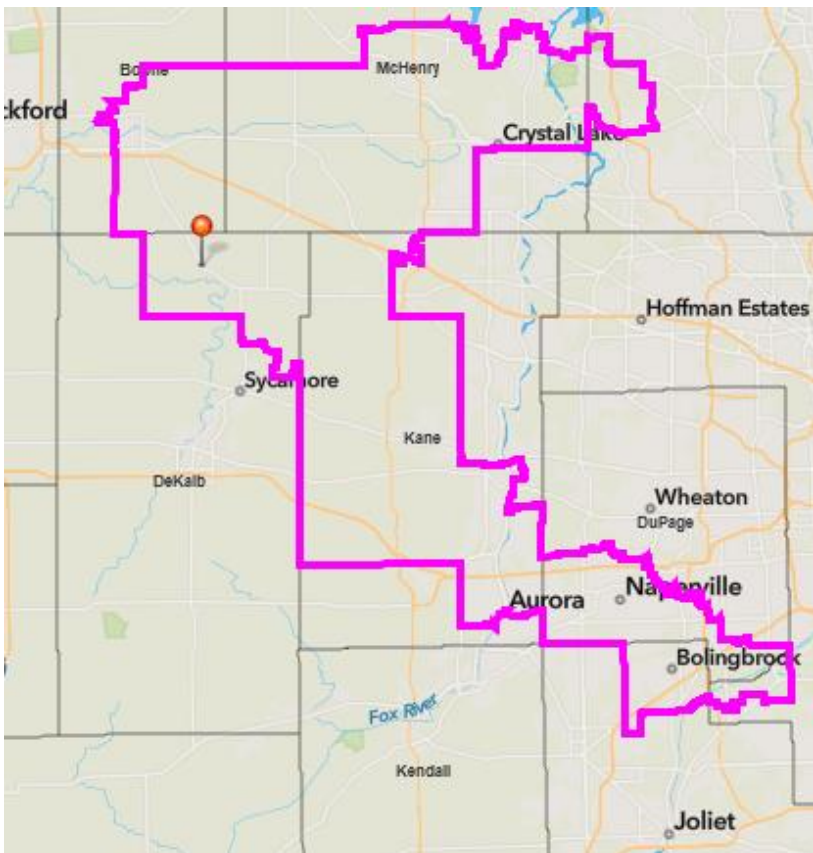

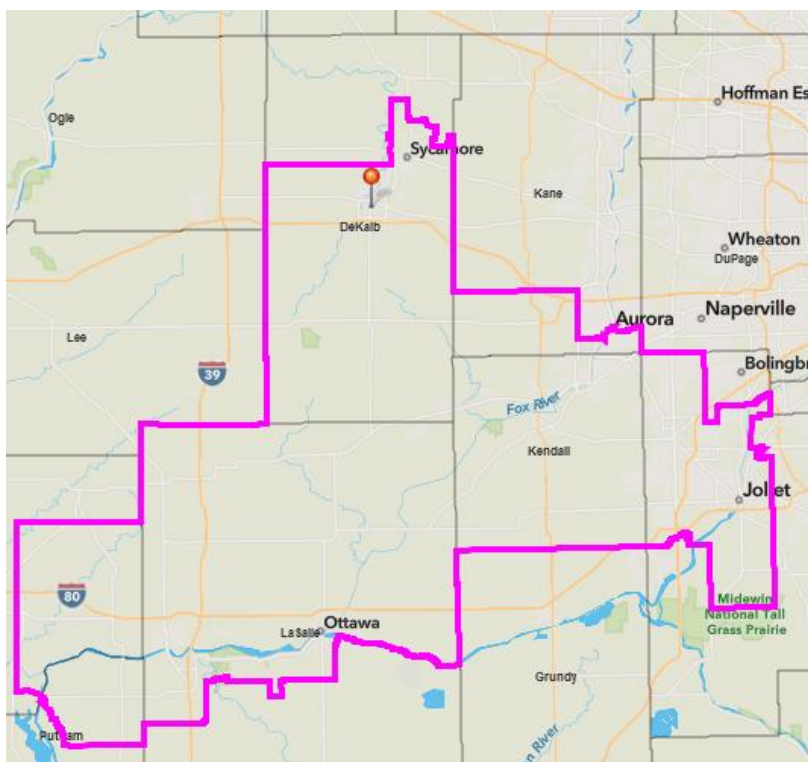

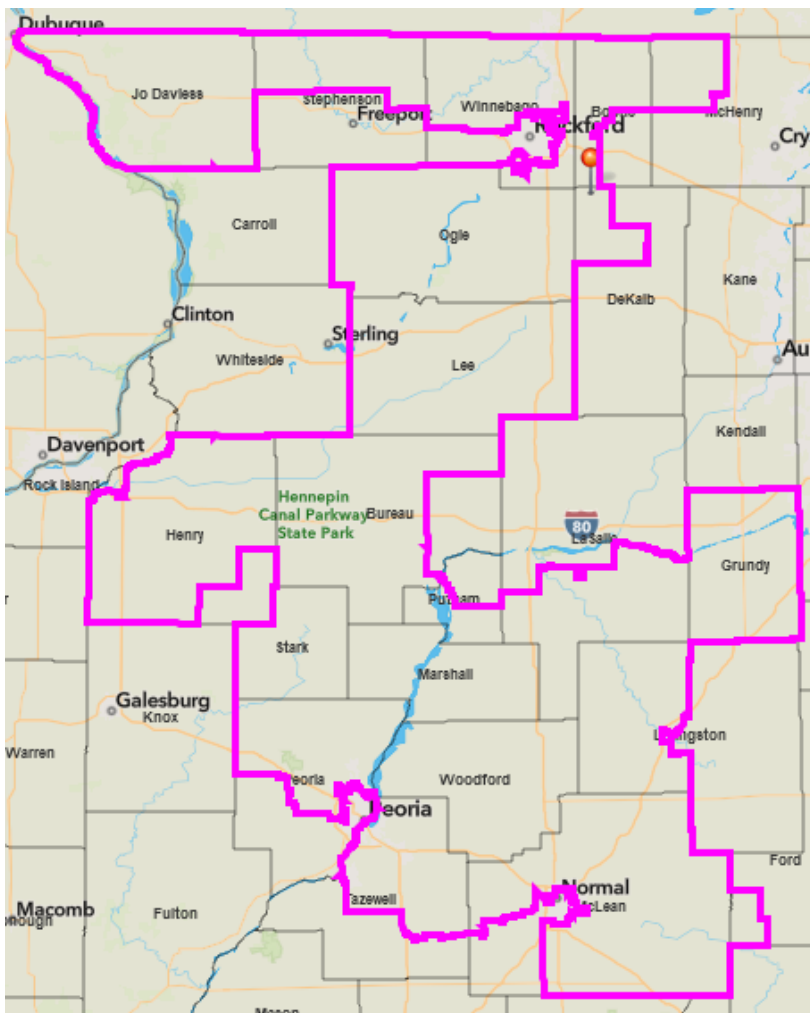

JUDICIAL BRANCH

U.S. Supreme Court

Established by the United States Constitution and began to take shape with the passage of the Judiciary Act of 1789. The first assembly of the court took place in 1790, with the Honorable John Jay named as Chief Justice of the U. S. Supreme Court, establishing the judicial branch of the United States Government. Supreme Court Justices are nominated by the President of the United States and confirmed by the United States Senate. They serve on the court until they resign, are impeached and convicted, retire or die.

While it is not a mandate, typically the Chief Justice administers the presidential oath of office.

ILLINOIS LEGISLATURE

The Illinois General Assembly, now in its 104th session, is composed of a 59-member Senate and a 118-member House of Representatives. One Senator is elected from each legislative district every four-year cycle. These districts are divided into two representative districts and one representative is elected from each representative district every two-year cycle. They are responsible for passing bills into law, approving the state budget, confirming appointments to state departments and agencies, acting on federal constitutional amendments, and propose constitutional amendments for Illinois. They are also responsible for the impeachment and conviction of executive and judicial officeholders in the state.

ILLINOIS STATE SENATE

State Senators are elected for four-year terms. Every two years approximately half of the Senate is elected so that not all Senators are up for election at the same time. There is a total of 59 members in the Illinois Senate. Currently, the Democrats are the majority party with 40 members and the Republicans, the minority, with 19 members.

Illinois Court System

The Judiciary of Illinois is the unified court system of Illinois responsible for applying the Constitution and laws of Illinois. It consists of the Supreme Court, Appellate Court, and Circuit Courts. The Supreme Court oversees the administration of the court system.

Illinois Supreme Court

The Supreme Court of Illinois is the state supreme court and consists of seven justices including a chief justice.

The court has limited original jurisdiction and has final appellate jurisdiction. It has mandatory jurisdiction in capital cases and cases where the constitutionality of laws has been called into question and has discretionary jurisdiction from the Illinois Appellate Court.

Illinois Appellate Court

The Illinois Appellate Court is the court of first appeal for civil and criminal cases rising in the Illinois circuit courts.

Three Illinois Appellate Court judges hear each case and the concurrence of two is necessary to render a decision. The Illinois Appellate Court will render its opinion in writing, in the form of a published opinion or an unpublished order. As of 1935, decisions of the Illinois Appellate Court became binding authority upon lower courts in Illinois.

The Illinois Appellate Court has fifty-four judges serving five districts, administratively centering around Chicago (1st District), Elgin (2nd District), Ottawa (3rd District), Springfield (4th District), and Mt. Vernon (5th District).

Civil cases appealed from the Illinois Appellate Court are heard by the Supreme Court of Illinois upon the grant of a Petition for Leave to Appeal under Illinois Supreme Court Rule 315, a Certificate of Importance under Illinois Supreme Court Rule 316, or a Petition for Appeal as a Matter of Right under Illinois Supreme Court Rule 317. The same rules apply to criminal cases.

Illinois Circuit Court

The Illinois circuit courts are trial courts of original jurisdiction. There are 24 judicial circuits in the state, each comprising one or more of Illinois' 102 counties. Six circuits comprise solely of a single county; these are Cook, Kane, Will, DuPage, Lake, and McHenry. The other 18 circuits each contain between 2 and 12 counties.

The circuit court has general jurisdiction and can decide, with few exceptions, any kind of case. The circuit court also shares jurisdiction with the Illinois Supreme Court to hear cases relating to revenue, mandamus, prohibition, and habeas corpus. However, if the Supreme Court chooses to exercise its jurisdiction over these cases, the circuit court may not decide them. The circuit court also reviews administrative decisions of certain state agencies.

DeKalb County operates under the township form of county government. The governing body is the County Board, which serves as the legislative branch of County government. The Board is responsible for adopting all ordinances for the governance of DeKalb County—contained within the DeKalb County Code—as well as establishing the annual budget, levying taxes, and setting policies, rules, and regulations for the management of County operations.

The County is divided into twelve districts based on population. Members are elected to four-year terms, with one member elected in each district every two-year cycle. However, all twenty-four members are elected at the November General Election in the second year following each decennial census.

The County Board meets on the third Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Additional meetings may be held at the call of the Chair or upon the request of at least one-third of the members. The Board maintains eight standing committees that meet monthly, and each Board Member serves on two committees. Committee appointments are made by the Chair with the concurrence of the County Board.

Board Members also serve concurrently as Commissioners of the DeKalb County Forest Preserve District. The Commissioners' meeting is held immediately following the County Board meeting on the third Wednesday of each month. Officers of the Forest Preserve District—President and Vice-President—are elected in the same manner as County Board officers and are traditionally the same individuals. The President appoints seven Commissioners to serve on the standing committee, which meets regularly each month.

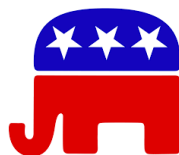

Our goal at the DeKalb Chief County Assessment Office is to provide to the constituents of DeKalb County accurate, efficient, and timely assessments of property valuation. In order to achieve this goal, the Chief County Assessment Office serves the resident taxpayers of DeKalb County with assessing their property value in accordance with the Property Tax Code 35ILCS200.

What we do for DeKalb County:

- Assemble township assessors for instruction on the assessment process.
- Maintains the parcel ownership record.
- Receive and analyze township assessment rolls.
- Equalize assessments within the county or any area therein.
- Apply various exemptions to homestead properties.
- Publish the assessment roll for each township in general reassessment year (quadrennial year).
- Provide mailed notice to owners of property which has been reassessed or changed by the Township Assessor, CCAO, Mapping Department or Board of Review.
- Certify assessment roll to the Board of Review.
- Report statistical abstracts to the Illinois Department of Revenue.
- Serve as Clerk of the Board of Review; act as Chair of the County Farmland Assessment Review Committee.

Each year the Board of Review convenes on/or before the first day in June. The board consists of three members appointed by the County Board. Two members must be from the political party receiving the highest vote for county office and one member from the other political party. The duties of the board include reviewing assessments made by Township Assessors, adding omitted property, and hearing all complaints on real property.

All complaints of error in assessments must be made in writing to the board on or within 30 days after the date of publication of the assessment list. (Reference is made to 35 ILCS 200 /16, of the Property Tax Code.)

The Board of Review also has the duty of equalizing assessments by township within the county. The board may increase or reduce any assessment as it determines is just. The board rules on all Home Improvement, Senior Citizen, Disabled Persons, and Veteran Exemptions. All certificates of error must be signed by at least two members of the Board of Review. When the board completes its work, the lists of assessed valuations are certified to the County Clerk to compute tax rates.

The Circuit Clerk is an elected position, voted on by DeKalb County citizens every four years. It is a Constitutional office and part of the 23rd Judicial Branch of Illinois, which includes Kendall County. The office is in the historical DeKalb County Courthouse located in the heart of downtown Sycamore.

By law, the Circuit Clerk's primary function is to establish, maintain and keep all records of Court proceedings as well as the Court Seal.

The duties and responsibilities of the Circuit Clerk are established by state statute, as well as by the Illinois Supreme Court, Administrative Office of the Illinois Court, and Local Rules set forth by the Chief Judge of the 23rd Judicial Circuit. The Circuit Clerk is the official record keeper of the Court. All Civil, Probate, Traffic, Criminal and Juvenile cases are filed through the Clerk's office. In addition to Court related duties, the Circuit Clerk is responsible for a number of administrative functions including processing all fines, fees and assessments that come through the office. A Deputy Circuit Clerk attends all Court proceedings and maintains a record of all transactions. This is the only way by which case files reach the Court. The Clerk's office also collects and disburses all monies ordered to be paid by the Court.

What the Community Development Director Does

The Community Development (CD) Director wears many hats, including:

- Zoning Administrator, Plat Officer, Chief Building Official, Code Enforcement Officer, and Economic Development Officer – *Oversees and enforces the county's zoning, building, subdivision, stormwater, floodplain and comprehensive planning regulations.*
- Director of the DeKalb County Regional Planning Commission – *Leads a partnership between the County and 14 municipalities to address regional planning and development issues.*
- Chair of the Stormwater Management Planning Committee – *Guides the county's stormwater policies and planning efforts.*

What Our Staff Does

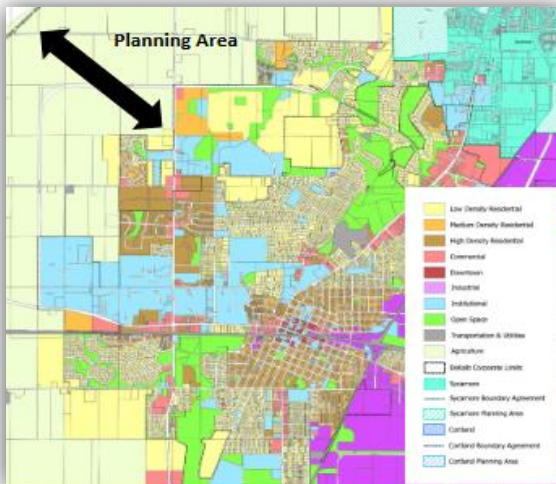
Our dedicated team supports a wide range of programs and services:

- Manages the DeKalb County Business Incubator
- Prepares and updates the County's Comprehensive Plan
- Coordinates planning and economic development efforts with local communities and agencies
- Reviews and issues building permits for unincorporated areas

- Investigates zoning complaints and violations

Decision-Making and Hearing Process

- The DeKalb County Board has final authority on how the Comprehensive Plan is interpreted and applied.
- Under Illinois law (Chapter 34, Illinois Revised Statutes), the County has a Zoning Hearing Officer who:
 - Holds public hearings for zoning changes, special uses, and appeals
 - Makes final decisions on certain zoning appeals and bulk regulation variances
 - Provides recommendations to the County Board for more complex zoning and land use requests
 - Subdivision proposals are reviewed and approved by the Planning, Zoning and Development Committee and the County Board

The Coroner's Office is a law enforcement investigative office mandated by the Statutes of the State of Illinois to investigate deaths within its jurisdiction, and the office's operations are governed by the Coroners Act (55 ILCS 5/ et seq.). The DeKalb County Coroner is an elected position and is a multifaceted department which operates 24 hours a day.

The coroner and/or the deputy coroners' responsibilities are to investigate all deaths of persons who have died in a sudden, violent, unexpected or suspicious manner, to determine the identity of an individual in circumstances where identity is difficult, to notify next of kin, and to determine cause and manner of death, which involves examining medical records, scene investigations, ordering autopsies, toxicology, histology and any other laboratory testing that could aid in determining the cause of death.

The coroner collaborates with law enforcement, EMS, forensic pathologists, and other experts to gather information to assist with piecing together the events surrounding a death. They additionally categorize the manner of death as natural, accident, suicide, homicide, or undetermined, depending on the circumstances.

The coroner is responsible for accurately completing the medical portion of the death certificate, listing cause and manner.

A few examples of calls received are: deaths of all patients registered with a hospice agency, all hospital deaths which occur within 24hrs of admittance, all anesthesia (surgical) deaths, fetal deaths over 20 weeks gestation, and any death where a hip fracture occurred within 13 months of death.

The coroner issues cremation permits for all cremations of decedents who have died in the county, regardless of the location of cremation. Currently, the permit fee for DeKalb County is \$100.00. It is at the coroner's discretion to waive this fee in certain circumstances, such as the death of a child.

The coroner may summon a jury to conduct an inquest into cause and manner of death. The essence of the juror's responsibility is to establish the manner, (suicide, homicide, accident, natural or undetermined), as the cause is often readily apparent and obvious based on the facts, circumstances, medical evidence, and in some cases toxicology and autopsy results.

It is the purpose of this office to do professional medicolegal death investigations with compassion and respect. ***Our commitment: Serving with Sensitivity, Leading with Integrity.***

The Dual Office of County Clerk & Recorder

The DeKalb County Clerk & Recorder fulfills five major statutory functions:

1. Clerk of the County Board and Keeper of County Records
2. Keeper of Vital Records (*birth, death, and marriage records*)
3. Tax Extension Clerk (*calculation of property taxes and redemption of delinquent taxes*)
4. Recorder of Deeds (*maintaining all land records for DeKalb County*)
5. Chief Election Authority for the County

Functions of the County Clerk

The County Clerk's Office operates under the statutes of the State of Illinois and is one of only three countywide offices commissioned by the Governor.

By law, the County Clerk:

- Files Assumed Business Names,
- Issues Marriage Licenses, and
- Records Statements of Economic Interest.

As a public service, the office also processes passport applications and provides information on national, state, county, and local governments.

The Clerk's Office serves as the official repository for DeKalb County vital records. Our collection includes birth and death certificates dating back to January 1878 and marriage records dating to the founding of the county in 1837. Certified copies of birth, death, and marriage records may be obtained through the Clerk's Vital Records Division for a nominal fee.

Functions of the County Recorder

The duties of the County Recorder are established by the Illinois Compiled Statutes. The Recorder is responsible for:

- Recording all documents submitted by the public that meet state standardization laws,
- Maintaining accurate maps and plats showing current ownership of every tract of land in the county, and
- Performing the clerical and technical functions necessary to preserve and protect those records.

In DeKalb County, the County Board has also directed the Recorder to maintain a Tract Index of real estate transactions. This index provides a complete record of property ownership, including mortgages, liens, and other encumbrances. The chain of title may be traced back to the original government grant through the Tract Index and the Grantor/Grantee Indexes.

The Recorder's Office additionally maintains and files:

- Federal and State Tax Liens,
- Uniform Commercial Code (UCC) filings, and
- Certified copies of recorded Military Discharge papers (DD-214s), which are provided free of charge to Veterans with proper identification.

Elections in DeKalb County

Effective December 1, 1980, the Election Consolidation Law established a uniform election schedule in Illinois beginning in 1982. Under this structure, the County Clerk serves as the chief election authority for DeKalb County, coordinating with township, municipal clerks, and other local officials responsible for certifying candidates and propositions to the ballot.

Voter Registration – Who Can Register?

- U.S. Citizen
 - 17 years old by the Primary *and* 18 by the General/ Consolidated Election
 - Not serving a sentence of confinement in a penal institution for a conviction
 - May not claim the right to vote anywhere else

ID Needed to Register

Two forms of ID required; one must show current name and address. Examples include:

- Illinois Driver's License or State ID
 - Employee or Student ID
 - Social Security Card, Birth Certificate, Credit Card
 - Utility Bill or Mail (postmarked within 30 days)
 - Valid Passport

Your registration is permanent unless you move or change your name.

Physically Disabled Voters

Voters with a permanent physical disability or mobility limitation may request to be placed on the permanent Vote by Mail list. Once approved, they will automatically receive a Vote by Mail ballot for each election without having to reapply. Contact the Elections Division for details or to obtain the required application form.

Military & Overseas Voters

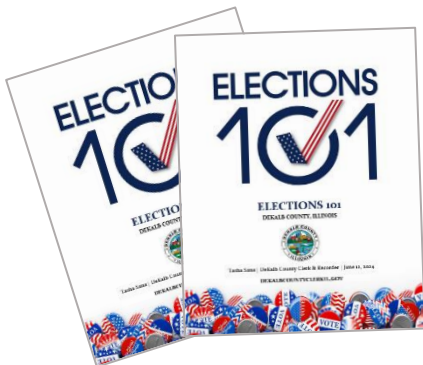

DeKalb County Court Services is responsible for providing a variety of services to adult and juvenile offenders as well as pretrial defendants under the jurisdiction of the Court. The Court Services Department is comprised of the Juvenile and Adult Probation Units, Community Restitution Services Program, and Pretrial Services. The existence of Court Services is due to statutory requirements as found in the Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 730, Section 110, The Probation and Probation Officers Act. The Act includes provisions for a system of probation and its duties and responsibilities under the authority of the Chief Judge of the Twenty-Third Judicial Circuit.

Court Services staff responds to the needs of the Court, the offenders, and the community by implementing evidence-based practices in the course of their daily work. The Probation Officer's role is to function as an agent of change – a case manager who orchestrates a variety of processes and interventions to ensure the offender is given what is needed at the right time to accomplish a positive behavior change. The Probation Officers assess and identify the offender's criminogenic needs to reduce the risk of re-offending and to become more pro-socially orientated. Using social learning techniques, the Probation Officers use skills to help motivate the offenders, refer to the right programs, reinforce the learning that takes place, and provide accountability to the process. Court Services Officers work closely with the Judiciary, the local police departments, social service agencies, schools, the State's Attorney's Office, and the Public Defender's Office. Court Services also reports to the Law and Justice Committee of the DeKalb County Board.

The Finance Department is responsible for managing a comprehensive financial system for the County; assisting in the preparation of the annual budget; overseeing the accounting of all department funds and financial procedures; processing accounts payable for all county departments; maintaining a record system including all revenues and expenditures; and acting as an information source and making recommendations to the County Board on all financial policies, procedures, and corresponding ordinances.

In addition, the finance office handles the bi-weekly payroll for all county departments, including the quarterly tax filing and the annual W-2 filing. Administration of the county's risk management function is also the responsibility of the Finance Department. Additionally, the county is audited annually by an independent CPA firm retained by the County Board and the Finance Department coordinates the entire audit process.

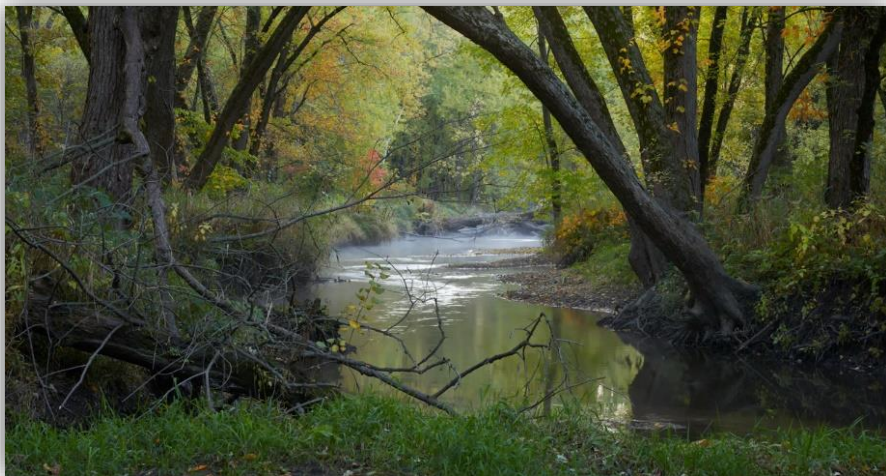

The DeKalb County Health Department, a department of county government, was founded in 1966. The Health Department offers a full array of public health programs and is certified by the Illinois Department of Public Health. The Health Department has four divisions.

The Administration Division oversees all administrative functions of the Health Department, including finance, human resources, planning, and program accountability. The Health Department is the County Registrar of the Vital Records Program for the issuance of birth and death certificates.

The Health Protection Division goal is to safeguard food and water from contamination. Services include regulation of private sewage systems and potable water. Additional programs include food sanitation, solid waste management, nuisance control and enforcement of tanning and body art regulations. The Animal Control Program provides stray dog and rabies control.

The Community Health and Prevention Division provides maternal and child health services such as Childhood Immunizations, the Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Nutrition Supplement Program, the Family Case Management Program for pregnant women and infants and the Family Planning and STD Program. In addition, the Communicable Disease (CD) Program provides services to prevent the spread of communicable diseases.

The Health Promotion and Emergency Preparedness Division oversees in-person counselors who provide assistance with enrollment in the Health Insurance Marketplace and expanded Medicaid implemented as part of the national Affordable Care Act. The Health Promotion Program provides services to the public to promote good health, improve the level of health knowledge within the community, and inform the residents of available health resources. The Emergency Preparedness Program improves county response capacity in the event of a public health emergency through planning activities.

The DeKalb County Engineer, under the direction of the County Board, makes improvements to and maintains the highway system. Some of these duties include maintaining the shoulders, ditches, drainage structures and pavement surfaces on county roads.

The County Highway Department maintains 181 miles of bituminous-paved highways and 50 bridge structures on the county road system. These interconnect with 798 miles of township roads and 141 township bridges of the nineteen townships. The Department also provides inspection of all county and township bridges every two years, reporting those findings to the Illinois Department of Transportation as required by Statute.

Other duties are maintaining highway and construction equipment, snow and ice removal, signing and roadside mowing. In conjunction with the County Highway Committee of the County Board, the County Engineer sets priorities for highway construction; administers the preparing and letting of contract proposals for bridge and road construction and directs the engineering staff through contract completion.

The County Engineer and his staff also provide engineering expertise and advise to township highway commissioners. As a result of cooperation between township highway road commissioners, personnel and other municipal officials, (as well as a close adherence to road standards) a well-maintained highway system can be found throughout DeKalb County.

The DeKalb County Community Mental Health Board (DCCMHB) funds services for DeKalb County residents who suffer from or are at risk of developing mental or substance use disorders or developmental disabilities. The DCCMHB is authorized under the Illinois Community Mental Health Act (405 ILCS 20/et seq.) and was established in DeKalb County, IL, by referendum in 1967. The Board consists of nine members who volunteer and represent the communities in DeKalb County, IL.

The DCCMHB provides stewardship of taxpayer dollars in funding services for mental health, substance use disorder, and developmental disabilities.

- *The DCCMHB plans, funds, and monitors mental health, developmental disability, and substance use disorder services within the county.*
- *The Board contracts with local agencies to provide needed services.*
- *The Board oversees the provision of services that the Board funds. It promotes accountability within the local mental health system by stipulating contractual conditions that agencies must meet to secure Board funding, as well as through community education and advocacy.*
- *The Board partners with local agencies and professionals to provide the community with free Mental Health First Aid classes and other workshops. The Board sponsors professional development opportunities for Mental Health Professionals, advocates for people who need services, and educates the community about behavioral healthcare topics.*

The Public Defender's Office is charged with the duty of representing individuals who have been declared indigent by the Court in criminal cases and select family and civil cases.

The office also represents minors in various juvenile proceedings.

To obtain services of the Public Defender's Office, one must appear in Court to request that the Public Defender be appointed and to complete an affidavit of assets and liabilities.

If the Court finds the applicant is indigent, the Public Defender's Office may be appointed. The Court may enter an order for the individual to pay some portion of the cost of the services of the Public Defender's Office as reimbursement to DeKalb County.

Responsibilities of the Regional Superintendent Educational Administration

- Regional Superintendents are locally elected officials who administer Regional Offices of Education, which are grouped by county or counties throughout Illinois.
- Respond to legal questions from educators, boards of education and other citizens. Issue, register and renew teacher certificates.
- Supervise and assist in transportation programs, scientific literacy programs and other staff development programs.
- Administer the G.E.D. testing programs and issue diplomas.
- Disseminate information on scholarships and teacher vacancies.
- Conduct professional growth opportunities.
- Approve school calendars, in-service days, workshops and institutes.
- Conduct hearings for School Districts reorganization.
- Administer Truancy Intervention programs and Safe School Alternative Education programs.

Cooperation Management

- Assist the Illinois State Board of Education in the evaluation and recognition of public schools, and private schools who ask to be recognized.
- Maintain maps of all school districts.
- Administer cooperative programs.
- Monitor public schools during strikes.
- Remove any member of a school board for failure to perform official duties.
- Assist with cooperatives, special education programs and vocational programs.
- Serve as Ex-Officio secretary of the Regional Board of School Trustees.

Financial

- Audit district claims for General State Aid, categorical funds, and Federal grants.
- Review budgets, audits, evidence of indebtedness and annual financial reports.
- Check bonding of school treasurers.
- Disburse state and federal funds.
- Act as administrative and/or fiscal agent for appropriate programs.

Health and Life Safety

- Visit and inspect each public school annually.
- Supervise school buildings for health and life safety and condemn buildings if necessary.
- Provide courses in safety and first aid for bus drivers.
- Approve and issue building permits and occupancy permits.

Public Relations

- Respond to questions and concerns, including legal questions from parents, teachers, administrators, boards of education and other citizens.
- Promote and support educational programs and achievements of the schools and educators.
- Hold public hearings on topics vital to education.
- Serve as liaison between the state legislature and local school districts.
- Serve as liaison between the Illinois State Board of Education and local school districts.

Transportation

The Regional Office is responsible for conducting the initial training required for all new school bus drivers prior to getting a bus permit and the annual refresher workshop required in the 12-month period prior to renewal. Experienced drivers must take a two-hour refresher course annually, and all new drivers must take an eight-hour course in school bus driver safety and first aid, as prescribed by the Illinois State Board of Education and administered by the ROE.

The DeKalb ROE also offers Criminal Background Check services (fingerprinting), provides a Testing Center for GED, teacher preparation, career promotion assessments, and coordinates substitute teachers for all of the schools in DeKalb County.

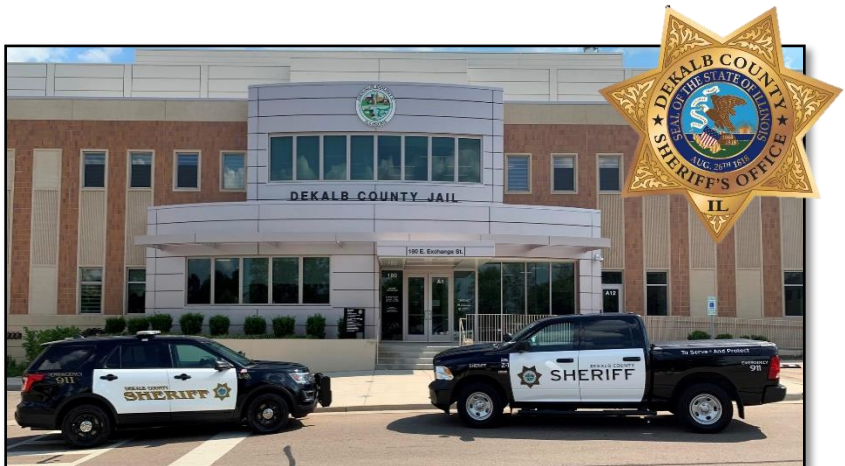

The Office of Sheriff originated in England in the 9th and 10th Century and is the oldest existing law enforcement unit in history. The expansion of the British Empire brought the Office of Sheriff to the colonies where it evolved into part of the American democratic fabric. Sheriff's Offices are a full-service law enforcement unit throughout most counties in the United States.

The DeKalb County Sheriff's Office has four basic areas of service. They are the Field Operations Division which includes patrol, and civil process; Corrections Division which is responsible for the operation of the County Jail, prisoner transport, Courthouse Security, and electronic home monitoring; Communications Division which includes the 911 Combined Communication Center; and Investigation Division which handles most criminal and other in-depth investigations.

There are 103 full-time personnel that provide service in these areas, as well as records and administration. The Sheriff's Office is available twenty-four hours a day, 365 days a year to serve the citizens of DeKalb County.

The State's Attorney is the chief law enforcement officer for the County. The State's Attorney's Office has the exclusive responsibility for prosecuting violations of the criminal laws of the State of Illinois, as well as traffic violations. The State's Attorney provides legal advice to all County Officials and represents the County in all actions where the County's officials or employees are a party.

The professional staff includes twelve Assistant State's Attorneys, five full-time support staff, and two part-time support staff. Assistant State's Attorneys are present to handle cases in all 7 courtrooms on an almost daily basis. Professional assistance to all of DeKalb County's law enforcement agencies is available on a 24-hour basis every day of the year.

The DeKalb County Treasurer serves as both Treasurer and Collector for DeKalb County.

As Collector, the Office prepares bills and receipts for the collection of real estate taxes, drainage taxes, and mobile home taxes within the county.

The Collector will collect, invest, and distribute more than \$218 million in property taxes this year. Taxes collected are invested while they are in the Treasurer's custody, prior to distribution. Interest earned on investments is distributed to the County's taxing districts proportional to the amount of tax collected for them. Property tax funds are distributed to more than 186 taxing districts in the county.

A tax sale is held at the end of each tax year to sell the tax on all parcels that remain unpaid.

The County Treasurer has the responsibility to receive, invest and distribute the revenue and public monies of the County.

She also collects and distributes, as required, transfers of monies from the state and federal governments. These transfers include, in part; sales tax, supplemental sales tax, income tax, income tax surcharge, salary reimbursement, replacement tax, emergency management assistance program monies, and motor fuel taxes.

The Treasurer also keeps accounts of all monies paid out stating the date, to whom payment is made, and on what account payment is made. Payments must be specifically authorized by law or by the County Board. Each month, the Treasurer reports to the County Board the amounts of money invested in banks listed by account. The County's funds are invested locally. Investment objectives are safety of principal, liquidity, and maximum rate of return.

The Treasurer serves as the ex-officio Treasurer for the DeKalb County 911 Emergency Telephone System Board (ETSB) and for Drainage Districts.

The Treasurer's Office administers the Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program. Property taxpayers who are 65 and older with a total household income of no more than \$55,000 may qualify for this program.

Between 1926 and 1976 a father and son team held the office of DeKalb County Clerk. Earle Joiner from 1926-1956 and Ralph Joiner from 1956-1976. It was Ralph's dream that the old records and other memorabilia, scattered throughout the Courthouse, could find a new, permanent home.

In the early 1980's Phyllis Kelley spent 18 months cataloging and indexing the contents of the old vaults. In 1988, work began transforming 400 square feet in the basement of the Courthouse to the Joiner History Room and dedicated to Ralph Joiner, his wife Bertha and Earle Joiner for their efforts in preserving the county's historical documents. Joiner History Room opened to the public on May 4, 1989.

In June 1998, following an agreement between the DeKalb County Board and the Sycamore Library Board, the Joiner History Room collection moved to space in the Sycamore Library.

As the Joiner History Room collection expanded, storage became a concern. In 2019 the Joiner History Room became part of the DeKalb County History Center and is now located in a much larger space and has expanded hours.

DeKalb County Board, by Resolution, determined that Jury Commissioners would be appointed by the Presiding Judge of the Circuit Court. The said commissioners each serve three-year staggered terms.

The Jury Commission is responsible for preparation required in establishing and summoning potential jurors. Qualified candidates are randomly selected by an automated system and are known as the jury list used for Petit, Coroner's, and Grand Jury's. The list is revised and amended annually. The potential jurors are chosen from a combined list of DeKalb County voters, DeKalb County State ID holders and DeKalb County Illinois driver's license holders from the Secretary of State. From this combined list the potential jurors are chosen arbitrarily by a computer program.

The Commission is responsible for the construction, refurbishing and/or maintenance of County buildings for which lease agreements are executed with the county.

The Public Building Commission also provides and maintains the records storage areas, for all county departments, as required by the Illinois Compiled Statutes. The PBC has constructed and maintains secure, climate-controlled storage areas to house all the historical records for the county dating back to 1835.

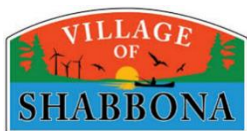

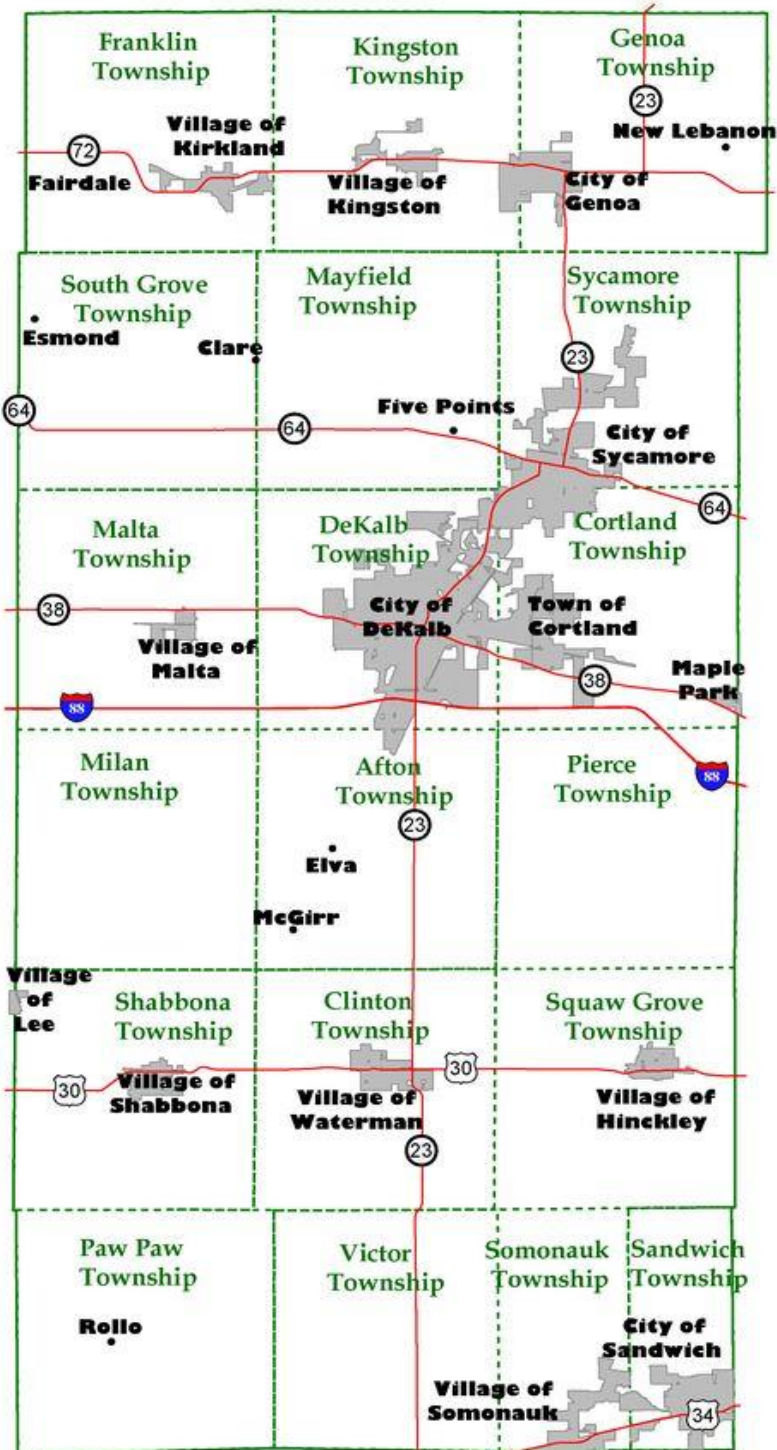
